A Coming of Age building for Genesis



2016 is a big year for Genesis – not only are we 21 years old but we've just received planning permission for an ambitious new building on Walcot Street. The new premises, the Genesis Centre, will be a training facility and attractive retail shop, where some of the most disadvantaged people in our community will be helped towards self-sufficiency and regular employment. It will also enable our staff team to be based together in one location.

The money to fund the new building will be raised via the Next Step Appeal to be launched in May. The appeal will be led by Dr. Alan Kerbey. We need to raise over £1 million as the current building needs significant upgrading. We aim to raise the money through the support of individual donors, trusts, companies; churches and the community.

We would like to encourage people to get behind this exciting and important project and to make a gift at a level they can afford. Whether small or large, each donation will be valued equally and will help to take us towards our target figure.

The restorative nature of Art

We always like to get feedback from people who use our services. Here is the story of one man who engaged with several of our projects whilst homeless and who found particular solace in doing art

Fifty year old Michael lost his job 3 years ago, and life spiralled quickly downhill until he became homeless and had to store his possessions in a friend's shed. He was at a very low point.

He was referred to Genesis Furniture Project for a one month placement by the job centre. When that ended he started attending a weekly art class run by another Genesis project: Life Skills.

He says he felt immediately at home there, with the group becoming like family to him. (He lost contact with his own family when he became homeless as he felt embarrassed at his predicament).

He says the art group kept him going through the darkest of times, it helped keep him focused and even though his situation was really difficult no one could take his skill in art away from him. Even though he was



homeless, he could still enjoy and fall back on doing something creative.

Now in 2016, thanks to ongoing support from Genesis, Michael is working at a local hotel and lives in a Curo flat. He is much happier and life is picking up once more. He has made contact again with his brother in Australia and has spoken for the first time to his family of his struggles. He aspires to owning his own home and is much more positive. He says

“you can never take life for granted; you can't assume all will be ok. When I became homeless I found an inner strength to help me cope day to day even though I felt very low inside. Strangely being homeless helped improve my art and I won't stop drawing, even though I'm in now in a better place. I feel I have a lot of positive in me, I have a purpose - I've come a long way and Genesis has been there for me all the way.”

Glorious Gloria

Lifeline manager Gloria Ware had her moment in the limelight on Christmas Day when she featured in a live broadcast of BBC 1's Songs of Praise from Bath Abbey. Gloria described the work she and her team do with homeless people in Bath using a pair of walking boots to illustrate the kind of items they give to people sleeping rough in the city. Gloria didn't seem phased by live TV and it was a beautiful service.



She says “I've seen a lot of joy over the years and a lot of sadness - I like being front of house and hearing people's stories bad and good.” She says “volunteering is a chance to give back. I've got a loving family and have had a good life and I enjoy helping people who've not been as fortunate - they all matter to me. I won't sit in a rocking chair with my shawl around me, I love people and this work keeps me young and open minded.”

Our exceptional volunteers

When we did an audit of our volunteers recently we realised that over 700 people are involved in delivering our projects. We value all of them hugely and have decided to feature just a few here.



82 year old grandmother Glenys Green has been volunteering at Lunchbox for 16 years.

She preps and cooks food but most importantly she actively engages with the clients, many of whom she's got to know well over the years.

Letti has been facilitating a very popular creative writing class for Life Skills since 2011 on a voluntary basis. Health issues have prevented her from working full time but she began a part time job as an administrator for her church in 2015.



“The staff at Genesis have a professional, caring & non-judgemental approach. This stood out for me from the start 'and it was important for me to respect my volunteer work in the same way that I would a paid role. Being consistent, reliable and hard working were qualities I wanted to bring every single week and this is one of the reasons why Genesis has played such an important part in my recovery. Thanks to them I felt something could finally shift. With my volunteer work, I learned to trust myself again and I was reminded that I could still give something of value to other people”
